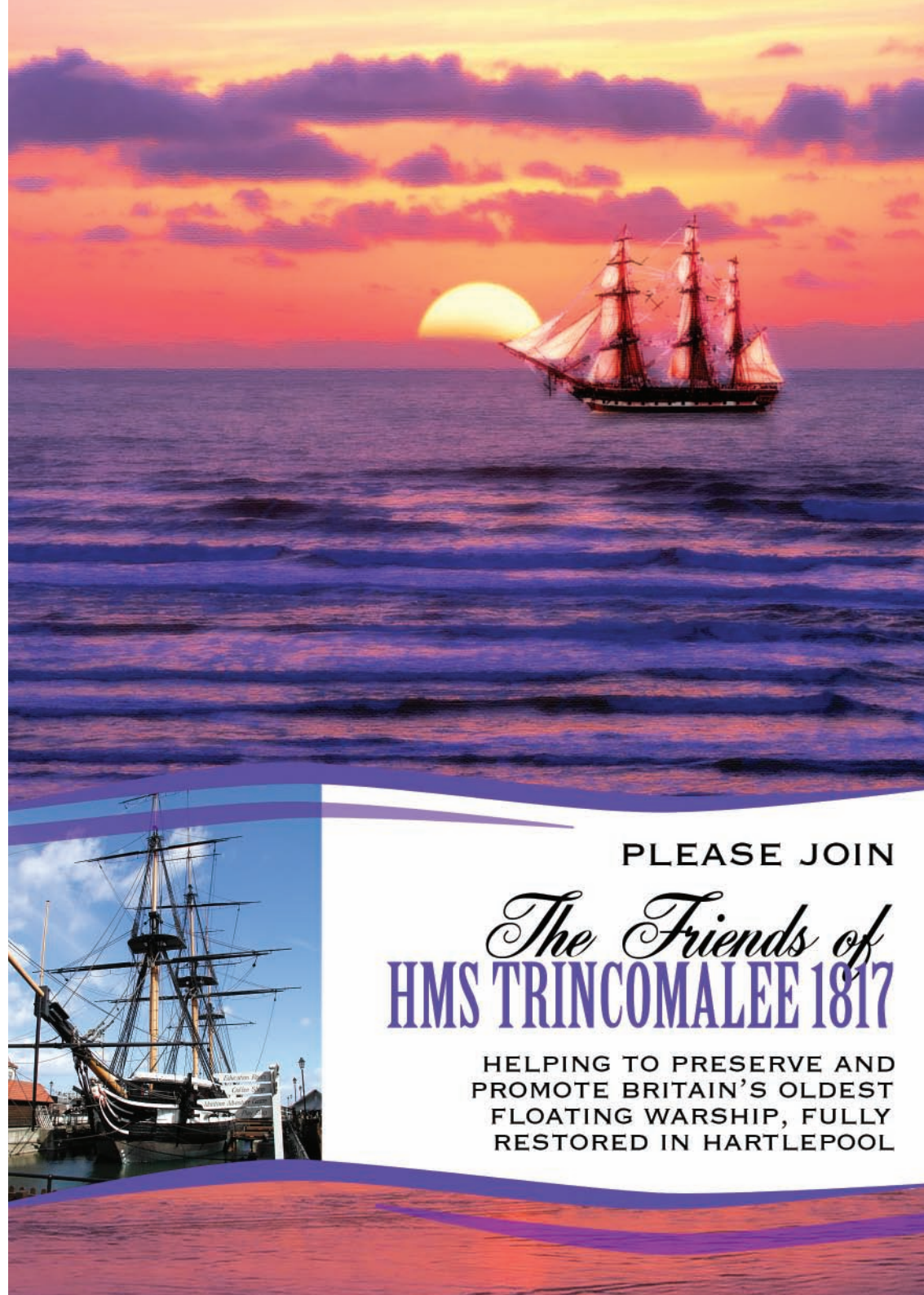

HMS TRINCOMALEE

- ❁ The Ship is a Leda Class Frigate built for the British Admiralty in Bombay in 1817
- ❁ The Ship saw active service from 1847 - 1855 in the North Atlantic and West Indies Station as well as in the Pacific Squadron based in Vancouver
- ❁ The Ship was sold for breaking in 1897 but was rescued by Geoffrey Wheatley Cobb who wanted the Ship for youth sea training and renamed her FOUROYANT.
- ❁ After Wheatley Cobb's death the Ship moved to Portsmouth under the auspices of the Society for Nautical Research
- ❁ She was re-commissioned along with Implacable in 1943 as a training ship for the Bounty Boys
- ❁ After the war She remained in Portsmouth providing a training base for young people until 1986
- ❁ In 1987 the Foudroyant Trust took the bold decision to restore the Ship to its original configuration of 1817
- ❁ The Ship reverted to its original name and a new Trust, the HMS Trincomalee Trust was formed in 1992 to take forward the restoration and make the Ship available to the general public
- ❁ The Ship's restoration which retained 60% of its original timbers was completed by 2001 and cost £10.5 million.
- ❁ The Trust was awarded an International Maritime Heritage Award in 2001 and is in the Core Collection of the National Register of Historic Vessels of the UK
- ❁ HMS Trincomalee remains in Hartlepool and is open to the public throughout the year. She is also available for functions, weddings, special events and filming
